Frances Wells won the county shorthand championship, and Linda Green was chosen most valuable girl player in the county high school basketball tournament. She was chosen on the all county and all district teams. Billy Davis made the all county team. Linda Green and William Pewitt represented H. H. S. at Girls' and Boys' State, respectively. We gave the Seniors a fine banquet which everyone enjoyed. Miss Jessie Carr Bourne was our sponsor.

In 1958 we entered our Senior year with twenty dignified Seniors. We elected William Pewitt, President; Carol Inman, Vice-President; Shirley Mangrum, Secretary; and Frances Well, Treasurer. We received our class rings in September, which we were all proud to wear. We raised money for our Senior trip by selling candy, magazines, and concessions. Our play entitled "Deacon Dubbs" was enjoyed by everyone. Linda Green was honored by being chosen "Miss Fire Prevention of Williamson County," and Lewis Whitehurst had the winning essay. Billy Davis was chosen on the all county and all district basketball teams. Velma Keys Bagsby was named class valedictorian and William Pewitt, salutatorian. Our sponsors were Mrs. Carl Owen and Mr. Milton Lillard.

We thank the students and teachers who have co-operated with us and helped us so much this year and all the years we have attended Hillsboro. We will never forget all the friends we made at Hillsboro High School.
