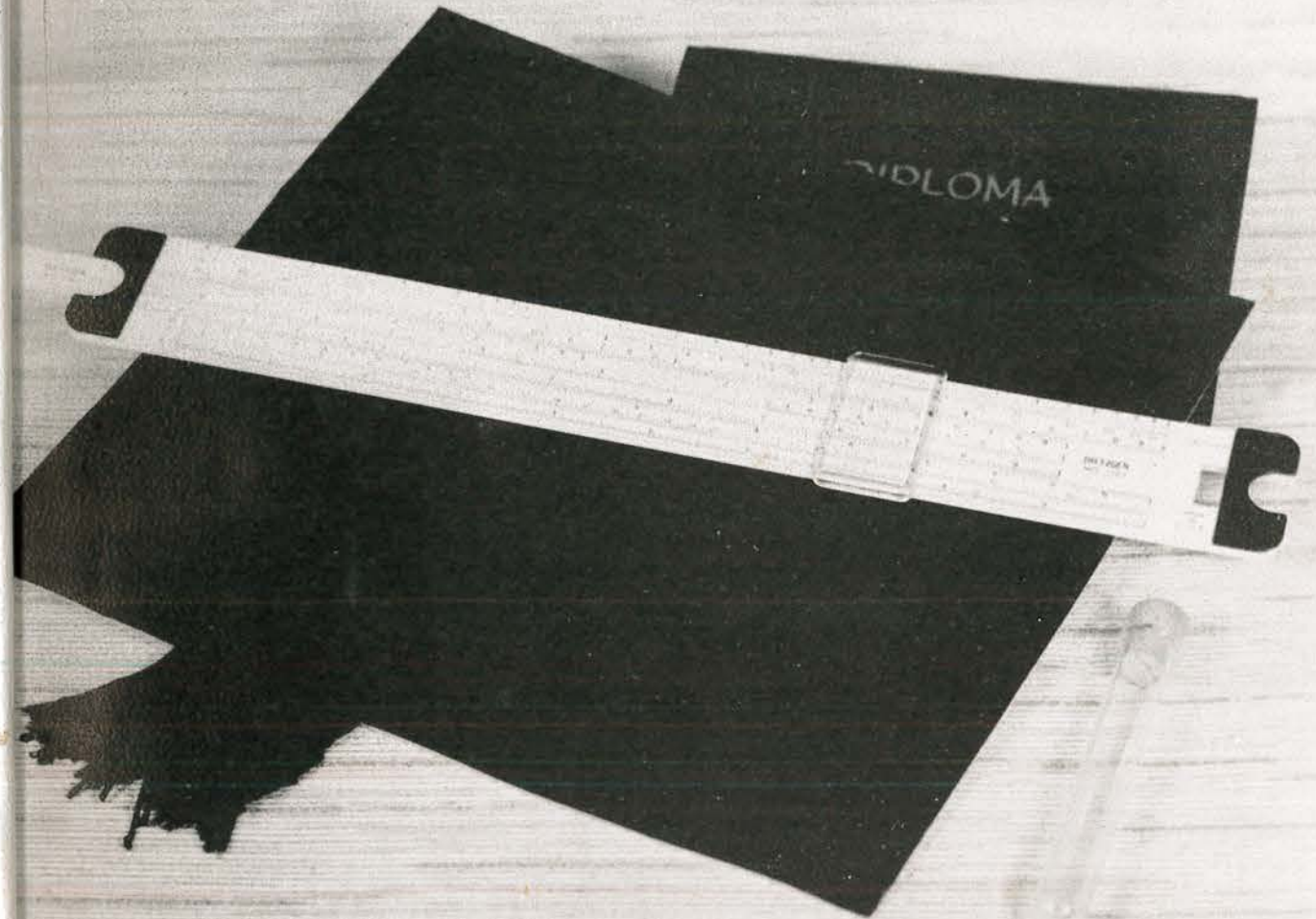

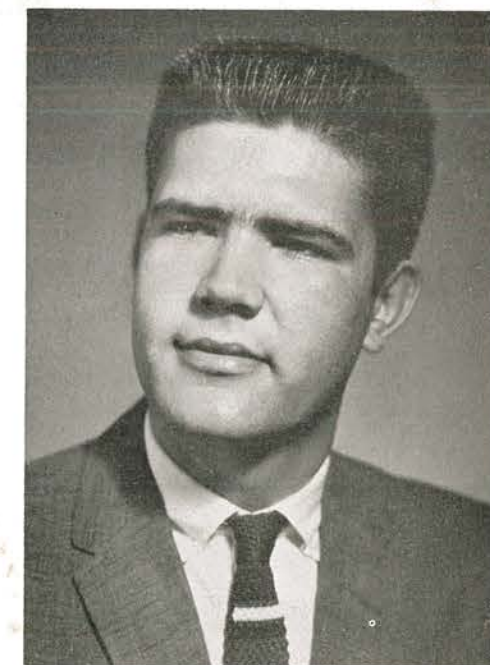

I, Riley Sewell, do hereby will my ability not to study too hard to Charles Hollars, but I don't think he needs it.

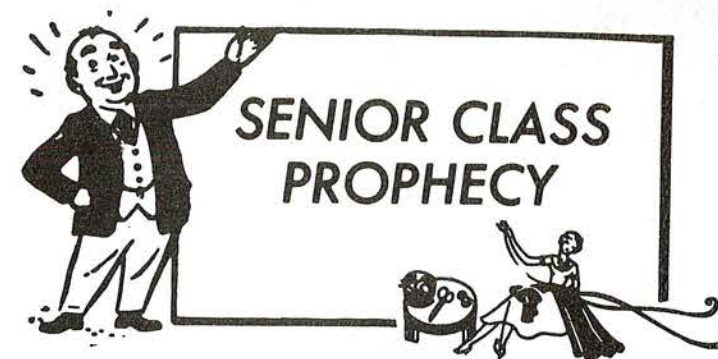
