

























#### Class History

As our twelfth year rolls by, we the seniors look back over the past and think of all the good times we have had together, as well as the hardships we shared.

In August, 1960, thirty-one freshmen entered the doors of Hillsboro High School. We were scared and excited as all freshmen are, but after the freshman initiation, we began to feel more like members of the family. Leading the way for us that year, we chose as officers: Frances Johnson, President; Bobby McCoy, Vice-President; Jeanetta Russell, Secretary; and Barbara Sweeney, Treasurer. Jeanetta Russell won the citizenship award that year. and for our entertainment, we enjoyed a party at school, with Mr. E. J. Robinson as our sponsor.

Our Sophomore year proved to be even more exciting and rewarding than the previous one. Serving as our officers were Lois Forrest, President; Nancy Cowell, Vice-President; Jeanetta Russell, Secretary; and Ruby Howell, Treasurer. That year, our number dropped to 26 members. Jeanetta Russell received the citizenship award again, and our class enjoyed a hayride and trip to Montgomery Bell Park, with Mr. Edward Greer and Mrs. Grant Dedman

As we became "upper-classmen," we suddenly realized that we only had one more year, and 26 juniors entered into the year full of steam. We chose for our class officers: Patricia Ryan, President; Pam Logan, Vice-President; Barbara Sweeney, Secretary; and Frances Johnson, Treasurer. Barbara Sweeney and Randall Mahan were chosen to represent the school at Volunteer Girls' and Boys' State, while Randall Mahan and Jeanetta Russell were selected King and Queen at the annual Halloween Carnival. That year, Barbara Sweeney won the Civitan Citizenship Award. The Juniors proudly entertained the Seniors with a banquet, the theme being "King Neptune." The money was raised by putting on our play, entitled "Murdered Alive." We enjoyed a hayride and a trip to Montgomery Bell Park with our sponsors, Mrs. Jerry Flatt and Mr. Robert A. Joines. With the measurements for our rings, our Junior year came to a close.

As we began our last year at H.H.S., we had only 16 seniors. The class elected Barbara Sweeney as President; Jeanetta Russell, Vice-President; Randall Mahan, Secretary; and Pam Logan, Treasurer. Pam Logan was also chosen by the class to be the editor of the school yearbook, THE CHIEFTAIN, with Althia Bates as assistant editor. We also presented our senior play, which was entitled "Bolts and Nuts." The Valedictorian from our class was Barbara Sweeney, with an average of 97.61 for the three and one half years. Salutatorian of the class was Jeanetta Russell, whose average was 92.55, for the same period. This year, we enjoyed another hayride for entertainment, and we were accompanied by Mrs. Wynford R. Peterson and Mr. Milton Lillard, our sponsors.

As we listen to the chorus sing our "Alma Mater," we look down the corridors and remember the places that we laughed, and sometimes cried; where we studied and talked together; where we learned life's lessons and became mature individuals. Within the covers of this book lies the record of our all-important year, 1962-63. We came as individuals to work, learn, and respect our fellow-man. And now, we go out to face the world with that which we have learned.
