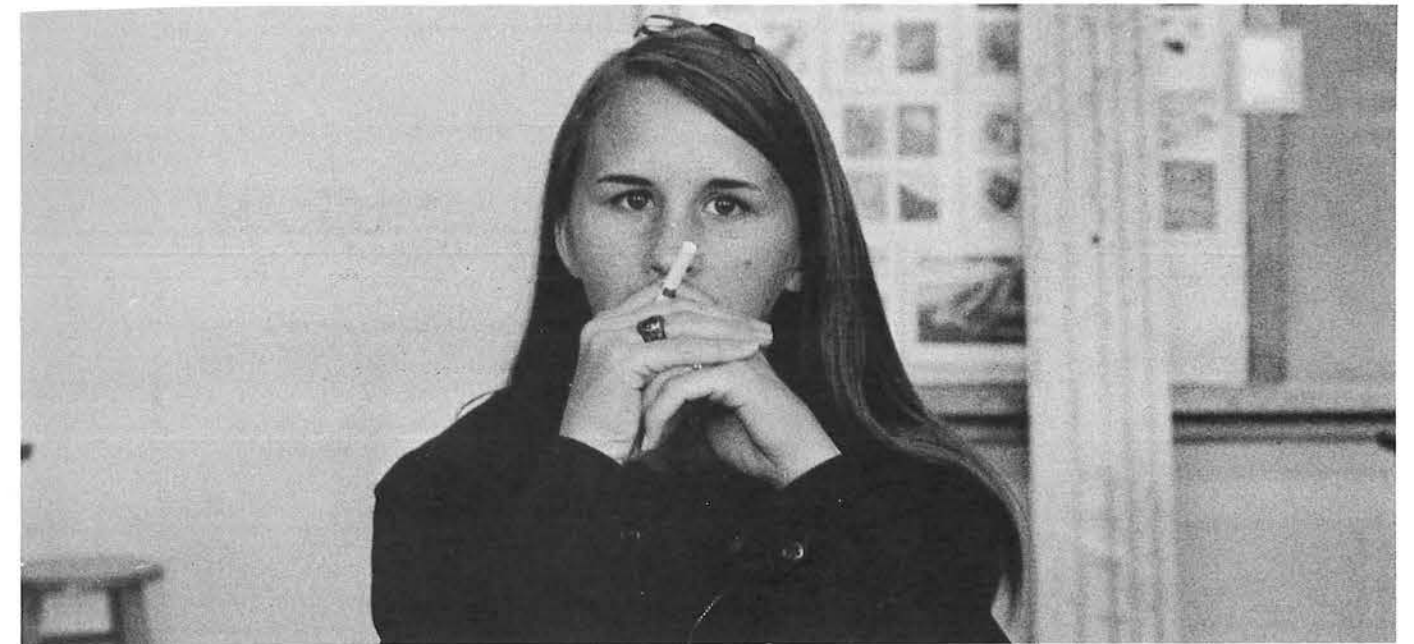

Get hold of yourself and say, "I can."



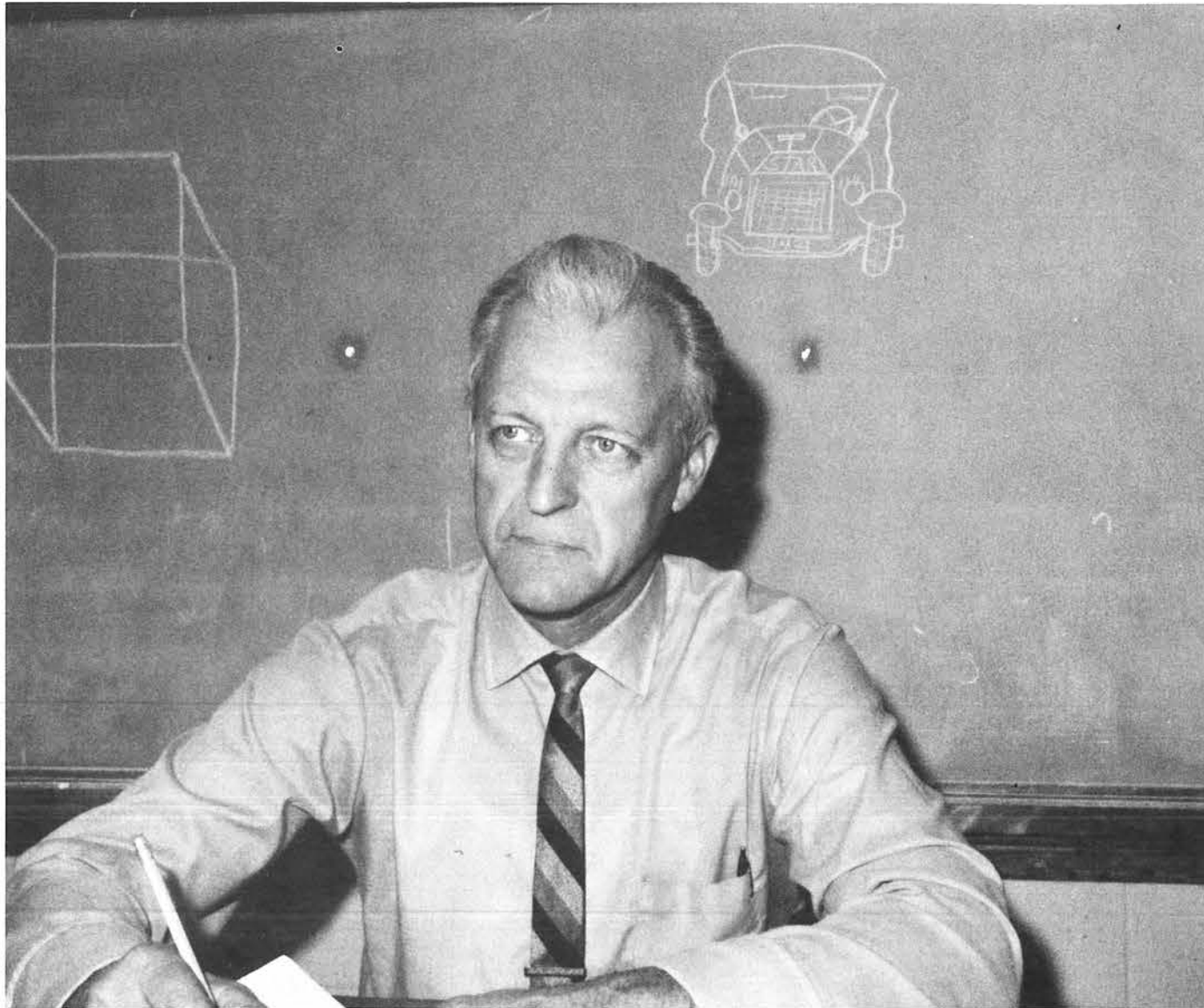

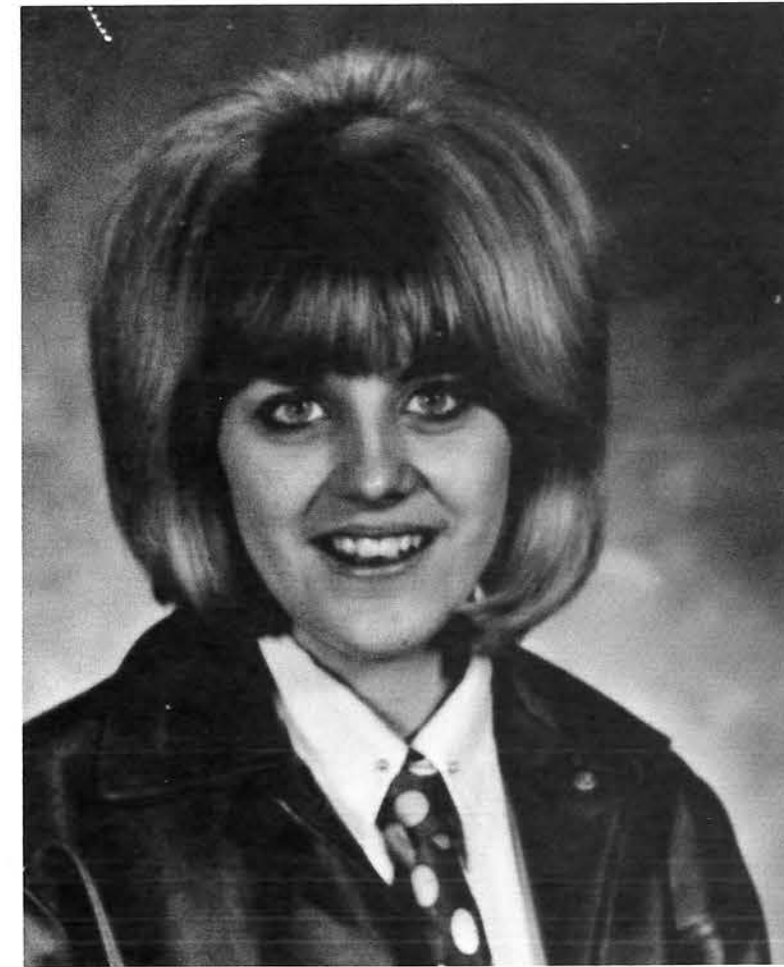
## Dedication

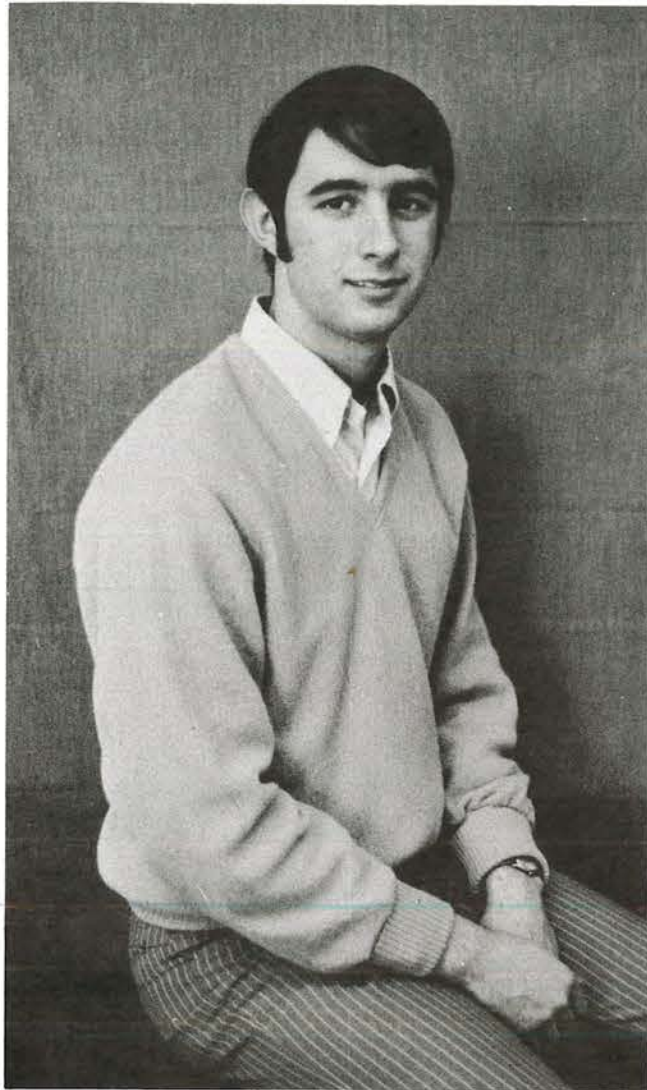

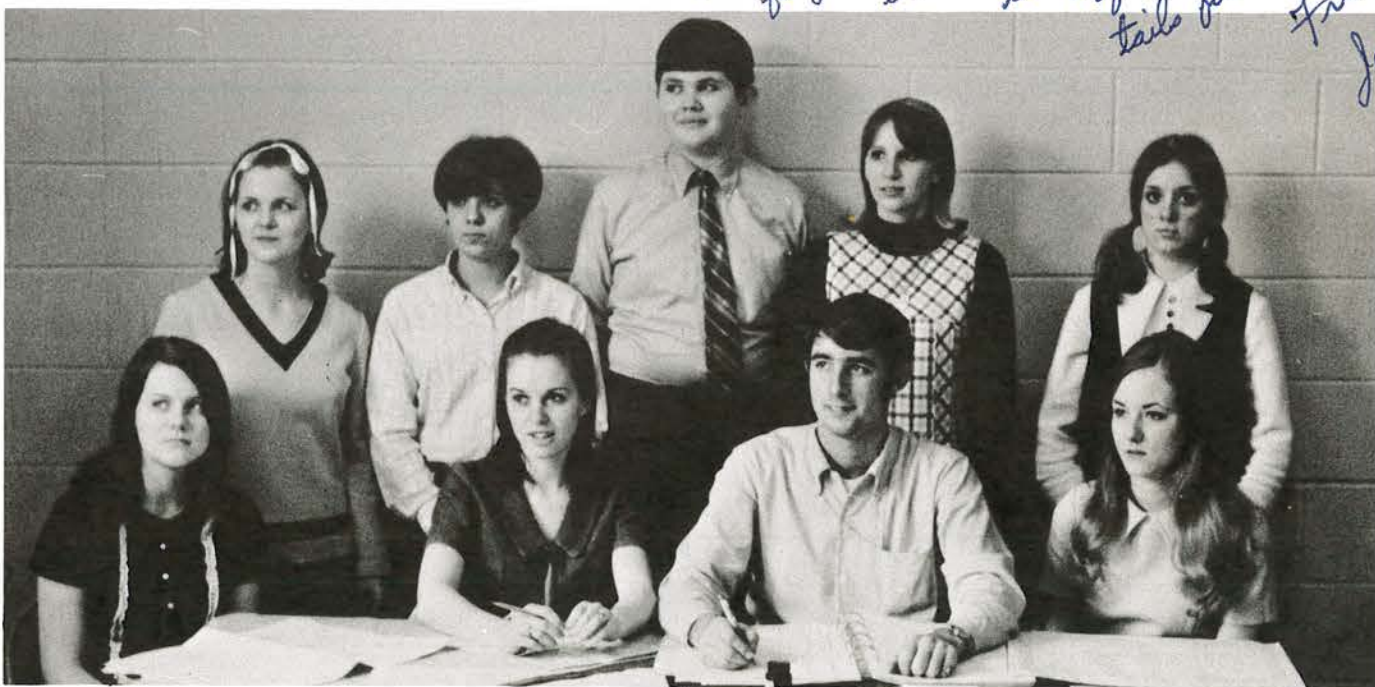




## "Parting Is Such A Sweet Sorrow"

She's now a cheerleader for the Harlem Globe Trotters.

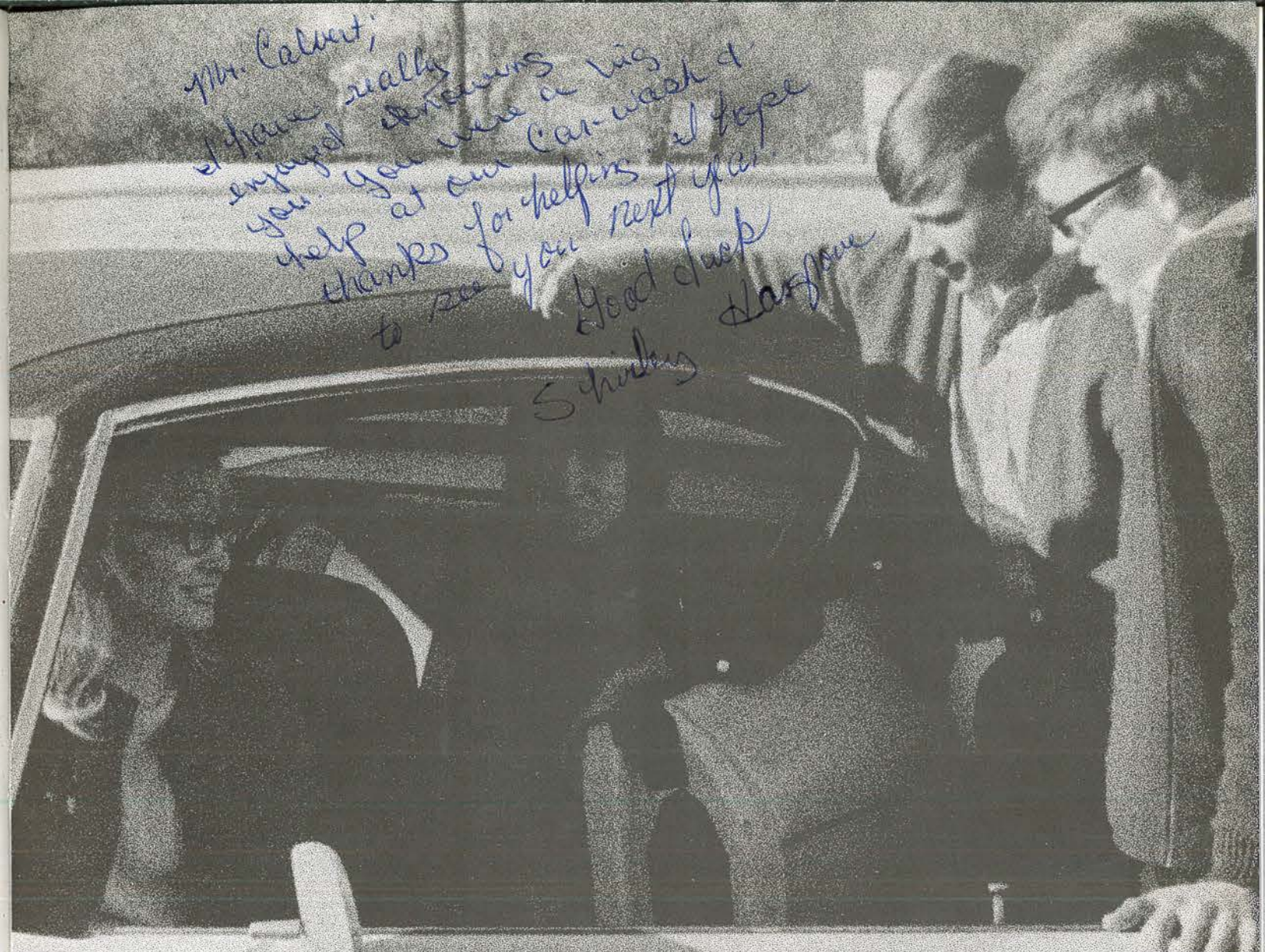
