


HILLSBORO 1976



1776 was a very important year for America, for it marked the birth of our nation and the beginning of 200 years of history. But the history of the Hillsboro area began long before 1776. An ancient Indian civilization blossomed and died along the banks of the Harpeth River years before any white man saw this fertile valley. Only thelow mounds of Old Town serve as reminders of this long-vanished culture.

In 1779, a group of men walked into Middle Tennessee and started a small settlement called Nashboro. One of these men was James Leiper, whose wanderings led him to explore this area of Williamson County. Although Leiper was killed during an Indian attack in 1781, he did leave his mark upon

this area. Leiper's Fork Creek is named after him.

After the Revolutionary War, many American soldiers were given land grants in return for their services during the fighting. Three families in particular were given grants in this area: the Hunters, whose descendants still own a large portion of the original grant; the Perkins, who built beautiful homes named Montpier and Meeting of the Waters; the Bentons, who gave our community its first name——Benton Town. Many of the old rock walls which were erected to encompass the land grants are still standing today, and the old cemeteries which dot the landscape are mute testamonies to the many hardships faced by these early settlers.

In 1801, the little community, which many people were now calling Hillsboro, became an important link in the Natchez Trace Post Road. The Natchez Trace had long been known as an Indian path and a traders' route, but the Army began in 1801 to widen and clear the Trace for use as a post road from Nashville to Natchez, Mississippi. A post office was set up in Hillsboro, and the people in Franklin had to build Carters Creek Pike to Hillsboro in order to get mail service. However, the post office created a problem to the community. There already existed in Coffee County a Hillsboro, Tennessee, with a post office, so the community had to change its name to Leiper's Fork.







Natchez Trace






The first half of the 1800's were years of prosperity for our area. The Indians were pushed westward, and more land was opened up for white settlement. Farms were large and required slave labor. Some slaves were treated well, and others were mistreated, but all longed for freedom. And in 1861, a great conflict began which would free the slaves and create a rift between the North and the South which would never be forgotten--the Civil War.

From 1861 to 1865 the armies of the Blue and the Gray marched and fought across Tennessee. Three major battles were fought in Middle Tennessee at Franklin, Nashville, and Murfreesboro. The Battle of Franklin fought on November 30, 1864, was one of the bloodiest and certainly the most futile battle of the entire war. In the space of five hours, the Confederates lost 6,000 men in fighting which caused one survivor to remark: "Would to God that I had never witnessed such a scene!" Five Confederate generals lay dead on the porch of Carnton while the Federal Army marched on to Nashville.


Many of the Confederate soldiers who died at Franklin were buried in a plot of ground which was donated by the owner of Carnton. The rows upon rows of markers and state monuments bear silent witness to the ferocity of

The late 1800's saw the rebuilding of farms and communities which had been touched by the war. The early 1900's found Leiper's Fork a thriving village. It boasted a blacksmith shop, a few small factories, some stores, a school, some fine old churches, and a bank. The Middle Tennessee Railroad ran a line between Franklin and Mt. Pleasant, and Leiper's Fork was one stop along the way. The South Harpeth Turnpike Company operated the Hillsboro Turnpike which ran through the village.


Today, however, Hillsboro is once again a sleepy little community. The farms are still here, though some have been sold for subdivisions. The bank failed during the Depression. The post office was closed, too, so that it seems to make no difference whether the village is called Hillsboro or Leiper's Fork. The railroad has disappeared; only the concrete piers for the trestles remain standing across the creek. The old toll house is sometimes used to store hay, and no child can ride the gate down now for the tollgate is no longer there.


Some things do remain. The school is an important center of community life, and the churches continue to open their doors each Sunday. The stores remain, and there are two gas stations. And most important of all, the people are still here, people whose family names bring to mind early settlers and important citizens——people who care about Hillsboro's history and its future. As long as these people remain, there will be a Hillsboro.

BASKETBALL A SHORT HISTORY

The game of basketball was invented in 1891 by a physical education instructor at the International YMCA Training School in Springfield, Massachusetts. This instructor was named James A. Naismith. The head of the physical education staff asked Naismith to devise a game that could be played indoors on winter evenings.



Naismith tacked two old peach baskets on the gymnasium balcony and divided his students into two teams. The teams played with a soccer ball. Each team had nine men: three forwards, three centers, and three guards. Later on, the teams had from five to nine men, and by 1897, the five-man team had become established.

In 1893 Geneva College of Beaver Falls, Pennsylvania, and the University of Iowa became the first colleges to play basketball. Smith College of Northampton, Massachusetts, organized the first women's team.

At first, the players could only move in certain zones, and only one or two players on each team could shoot. But rule changes and the development of the dribble changed basketball into the games as we know it today. In 1936, basketball became a part of the Olympic Games when twenty-two nations entered teams in international competition.


